

## **Silver Service**

A rare George III silver coffee Biggin is valued at £4,000-£6,000 in the Charterhouse two day specialist auction of silver, jewellery and watches on **Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> April and Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> May**

Of classical form, it was made by Paul Storr, one of the country’s leading 19<sup>th</sup> century silversmiths, in 1803.

This coffee Biggin, along with various other items of silver from trays to a wine funnel, were taken to a valuation day at The Long Street Salerooms, Sherborne, in a vintage suitcase where they had been hiding away for over a quarter of a century.
